Marching Band Contest[.]

One of the most important parts of a band show is the audience. It is very disappointing for band members who spend weeks and months preparing a show to walk into a large stadium and find that the seats are empty. There are many types of spectators at a band show and they have many different reasons for coming to the show. However, they all have one thing in common and that is that they should be allowed to enjoy the experience.

Things you should do at a band show.

- 1) Support all bands. Regardless of which band is on the field you should applaud or even cheer when they do a good job. Reaction from the crowd will encourage the band to perform better and will result in a more enjoyable show for the audience.
- 2) Watch the whole show. Observe different elements of the bands performance. Your interest may be percussion but you might be surprised with the work the color guard is doing. Often, several things are going on at once in a show. If you watch a show several times you may see something new on each occasion.
- 3) Show up early. This is especially true for supporters of larger class bands. Many smaller class bands have great shows. Arrive early at the next show and see what you have been missing.
- 4) Buy something from the concession stand. In many cases a band competition may be the major source of a band programs yearly budget. They have made a large investment and would appreciate your support. In most cases you will find that the prices are much less than what you will pay at your local movie theater.

Things that you should avoid.

- 1) It is important to realize that although it is fun to visit with family and friends during a contest, it is unfair to distract other spectators from enjoying the show. This is true at any performance, including a marching band performance. Be respectful of all other spectators and hopefully they will extend you the same courtesy.
- 2) Do not leave or enter the stadium while a band is performing. Try to avoid any unnecessary movement, especially while a band is performing. At most contests the time for each band is fifteen minutes. Each show lasts around 7 to 9 minutes so that gives you plenty of time between bands to leave the seating area for concessions or to enter the stadium.
- 3) Do not talk on your cell phone. Turn off your cell phone or set it to vibrate. If someone calls you on your cell phone you can return the call between bands. Please do not talk on your phone during a performance.
- 4) Do not allow children to play in the stand and distract other spectators. Obviously, children are the future of this activity. It is good for them to see why big brother and big sister are always at practice and are not at home. However, for their safety and as a courtesy to others they should not be allowed to run up and down steps and play in the aisles so others may enjoy the show.
- 5) Do not make negative comments about other bands. That color guard uniform that you don't like may have been made that guard members mother that is sitting behind you. That man sitting in front of you could be the arranger or drill designer or even the band director. If you don't have something nice to say then you probably should not say it. Remember how hard your bands' members have worked to get their ready for the field. Changes are that the other bands have worked just as hard to get their show read.
- 6) Do not obstruct the view of others. Please avoid standing in front of people trying to watch the show. If you have a banner to display, try to do so from the top of the stand or in some way that others can still see the bands.
- Do not boo other bands or the contest results during the awards. Unfortunately, every one is not going to agree on contest results.
 Booing the award winners or the judges will not accomplish positive results.

Hopefully these tips will make your experience more enjoyable as you cheer your favorite band on and support all the performers of this amazing art form.

Mr. Ray inherited his love of music and teaching from his talented family. His father sang in a gospel trio while his mother played piano, they were also both educators.

Kelley is in the fifth year as he manages and directs the MCHS instrumental Jazz program, teaching Theory and Improvisation, as well as directing the big bands and combos. He also teaches AP Music Theory and guitar classes. He assists with directing the overall band program and serves as the musical arranger and a computer for both the Mustang Marching Band and the concert band.

In his 20+ years as a musical educator, Mr. Ray has been a director at many institutions including the Fulton and Graves County School systems. Ballard Memorial and the former Lone Oak High School. Prior to his teaching career, Kelley worked both a professional touring and studio musician. He has earned advanced degrees in Vocal and Brass Performance also Jazz Studies from Campbellsville University and Stephen F. Austin State University. At Murray State University he received a Rank I Education Certification. Mr. Ray is a member of the Kentucky Music Educators Association and the National Association for Music Educators.



Ralph Matlock Director of Percussion

Mr. Matlock is directing the Mustang percussion for the fourth year. He has been instructing drumlines for over 20 years now with schools in Tennessee and Kentucky. He is a 2005 graduate of Murray State University College of Business with a minor in Music. While attending college, he was also a member of the Murray State Racer Band.

In addition to instructing percussionists during the fall marching, Ralph works with students in the springtime with a percussion ensemble to help the students develop a well round percussion experience.



John Lovell Band Director

Mr. Lovell has served 17 years in music education at the high school level and is in his second year with the Mustang family. His responsibilities are to oversee the total band program with an ever increasing number of students. He directs the Mustang Marching Band, 3 concert bands, percussion ensemble, pep band and teaches guitar classes.

A graduate of Christian County High School in 1994, he went on to earn his Bachelor's of Science and Master's degree in Music from Austin Peay University. His groups have consistently earned distinguished ratings for concert bands while concert and marching programs have competed at the state levels.

Mr. Lovell currently resides in West Paducah with his wife of 15 years, Cara; son Landon and daughter, Kendall. The family attends Lone Oak Church of Christ.



Stephanie Buchanon Front Ensemble Instructor

Mrs. Buchanon is entering into her tenth year as an educator and her second year as the piano instructor for McCracken County High School. In addition to her piano teaching, Mrs. Buchanon also co-teaches the morning ensemble class and instructs the front ensemble for the Mustangs Marching Band.

A 1999 graduate of Ballard Memorial High School, she performed in the front ensemble for Ballard's marching band (serving two years as section leader), was a student conductor for band and choir in her senior year, and was the recepient of the John Phillip Sousa Band Award. Mrs. Buchanon received her Bachelor of Music degree from Union University in 2003 and her Master of Arts in Education from Murray State University in 2016. In her music career, she has taught music at all grade levels (pre-K through 12th), served as a church pianist, and has taught voice and piano as a private instructor.




Jeremy Watwood Guard Caption Head






